WINE

ARGENTINA

A single grape variety Chardonnay (100%) 2,25 L bag-in-box from Mendoza, Tupungato (or sub appellation) vintage 2015 with no or discreet oak influence (3,5 – 5,6 €)

AUSTRALIA

A red single grape variety Cabernet Sauvignon, unfiltered, manual harvest, vintage 2014 or younger from Victoria Yarra Valley with no use of new oak and max. 13 % alcohol (4 – 7 €); and a single grape variety Semillon, vintage 2006 / 2007 / 2009 from New South Wales, Hunter Valley (4 – 9 €)

AUSTRIA

An organic single grape variety Zweigelt rosé from Niederösterreich or sub appellation (1,4 – 2,5 €); a single grape variety Blaufränkisch or Sankt Laurent 2,25 L bag-in-box from Burgenland or sub appellation (4 – 10 €); and a single grape variety Zweigelt red from Niederösterreich or sub appellation in a light weigh bottle (1,4 – 2,5 €).

CHILE

A sustainable single grape variety Pais, Pinot Noir or Carmenère vintage 2015 in 750 ml PET bottle (1 – 1,5 €)

FRANCE

A Muscat from Ribeauvillé-Riquewihr, Alsace (2,8 – 5,5 €); An Organic Pinot Blanc from Alsace (2,8 – 5,5 €); a wood fermented Chassagne Montrachet white wine (11 – 19 €); a Petit Chablis (2,5 – 4 €); a Sauvignon blanc based Pétillant (1,8 – 2,5 €); an organic white from Coteaux-d'Aix-en-Provence (2,8 – 5,5 €); a Gamay from Mâcon (2,5 – 4 €); A red burgundy from Hautes-Côtes de Nuits / Côte de Nuits (2,8 – 5,5 €); a spontaneously fermented red Sancerre (5 – 10,5 €); a Chardonnay and Savagning from Jura (4 – 14 €); an organic red BiB from Bergerad (5 – 8 €); an aged Merlot based red from Pécharmant (4 – 7,2 €); an unfiltered Santenay from old vines (5 – 10,5 €); an amphora aged red (4 – 14 €); a Saussignac influenced by Botrytis Cinerea (5 – 10,5 €); an organic Champagne (14 – 27 €); A spontaneously fermented red from Volnay (11 – 19 €); and an organic Châteauneuf-du-Pape red (11 – 19 €).

GERMANY

A white blend from QbA Pfalz in PET-bottle (1,4 – 2,5 €); a Riesling Kabinett 2,25 L BiB from Rheinhessen (3,5 – 4,2 €); a GG Pfalzer Riesling from Forst Jesuitengarten (9 – 19 €); a GG Rheinhessen Riesling (9 – 19 €); an Erste Lage within Württemberg Riesling (5 – 10,5 €).

GREECE

A PGI classified single grape variety Malagousia with a minimum available volume of 8,000 bottles (3,2 – 6 €).

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HUNGARY

A Furmint Tokaji Szaraz vintage 2014 or younger (2,8 – 5,9 €); An unfiltered Egri Bikaver without use of cultivated yeast vintage 2013 (2,8 – 5,5 €); A wood fermented Juhfark from Somloi vintage 2012 or 2013 (5 – 9 €); and 5 Puttonyos Takaji Aszú vintage 2006 or 2007 (5 – 11 €).

ITALY

A rosé frizzante secco from Lambrusco Grasparossa di Castelvetro (2,5 – 4,7 €); DOCG Chianti Classico with grapes from Panzano (2,8 – 5,5 €); Vermentino di Sardegna (1,4 – 2,5 €); Cortona Syrah (4 – 7,2 €); Organic Rosso di Montalcino (4 – 14 €); Chianti Classico Gran Selezione from Castellina in Chianti, Greve or Radda (8 – 16 €); Biodynamic red from Tuscany or Abruzzo (2,8 – 5,5 €); Babaresco with Menzioni geografiche aggiuntive (11 – 19 €); Brunello di Montalcino from Montosoli hill (11 – 21 €).

NEW ZEALAND

An organic single grape variety Pinot Noir with no use of new oak vintage 2014 or younger from Central Otago, Waitaki, Canterbury, Waipara, Marlborough or Nelson (5 – 10,5 €); and an unoaked single grape variety Chardonnay vintage 2015 from Nelson (2,8 – 6 €).

PORTUGAL

A Verdelho from VR Alentejano (1,4 – 2,5 €); A Tawny port wine from Douro in 200 ml bottle (2 – 3,5 €); A L.B.V. from Douro in 200 ml bottle (2 – 3,5 €); A 20 years old Tawny port wine (11 – 17 €); A Moscatel de Setúbal in smaller bottle with Min. 9 years ageing in wood (6 – 11 €).

SOUTH AFRICA

An ethically certified red blend based on min. 90 % Shiraz and Grenache (2,5 – 4 €); an oak aged Cabernet Sauvignon from Robertson (4 – 7 €); a Pinot Noir from Walker Bay (4 -14 €); a single grape variety Chardonnay Méthode Cap Classique Sparkling (4 – 7,2 €); and a low alcohol and ethically certified Moscato (1,4 – 3,5 €).

SPAIN

A Malvasía Volcánica Seco from Lanzarote (2,5 – 4 €); a Listan Blanco from Tenerife (5 – 9 €); a Listan Negro from old vines in DO Valle de la Orotava (4 – 7,2 €); a Do Penèdes sparkling (2,8 – 5,3 €); a Graciano from old vines Rioja (4 – 7,2 €); a Garnacha from Rioja Alavesa and or Rioja Alta (2,8 – 5,5 €); and a Tempranillo from Rioja Alta (5 – 10,5 €).

USA

A sustainable Pinot Noir BiB from from North Coast, California (6 – 11 €); a Pinot Noir from Carneros or Sonoma Coast (Petaluma Gap) (6 – 12 €); a red blend based on min. 60 % Grenache Noir, Syrah, Mourvedre and/or Cinsault from Paso Robles (2,5 – 4 €); A Zinfandel from Dry Creek Valley (6 – 12 €).

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BEER

Any Country: A Vintage Ale 2013 or older with a minimum yearly available volume of 1200 bottles (4 – 9 €).

Specified Countries: **Germany**: a Kellerbier in 500 ml glass bottle (0,3 – 0,7 €); **USA**: a pils/pilsner in a <= 355 ml can (0,3 – 0,9 €) and an IPA or similar designation in a <= 355 ml can (0,5 – 1,4 €); **Belgium**: an Oude Geuze Belgian Lambic in a 375 ml glass bottle with cork closure (1,5 – 4 €).

CIDER

A dry or medium dry apple cider influenced by bitter apples from UK in a Max 500 ml glass bottle (0,5 – 2,2 €); a cidre bouché from Pays d'Auge, France in a 750 ml glass bottle (2,5 – 7 €); and a Sidra Natural Tradicional from Asturias, Spain in a 750 ml glass bottle (2,5 – 6 €).

SPIRITS

A Moonshine in glass screw top jar from USA (3,5 – 11 €); a Cherry liqueur from Denmark (4 – 8 €); an XO Cognac Très Vieille from Grande Champagne (15 – 40 €); a Single Malt Scotch Whisky from Scotland (15 – 40 €); a Multi-pack of 5 different Single Malt Scotch Whisky from Scotland (25 – 53 €).
